A message from our Board President and Executive Director

Dear Friends,

As the people's voice for Narragansett Bay for 53 years, Save The Bay has always responded to the major challenges facing the Bay with energy, passion, and highly effective advocacy. The results have been spectacular: a cleaner, healthier Bay, greater access to its shores for all, and new generations of stewards engaged in our mission to protect and improve Narragansett Bay.

The series of winter storms that ended 2023 and began 2024 were a jarring reminder of today's challenges. The historic flooding of coastal and riverside neighborhoods, and the rapid erosion of beaches and dunes, delivered a message that Narragansett Bay needs us - all of us - more than ever. Climate change is here. It's all hands on deck.

Thanks to our supporters, in 2023 Save The Bay stepped up to meet this challenge.

Over the past year, we achieved a major milestone in the restoration of the Kickemuit River by removing a dam that was causing stagnant water and blocking tidal waters. We partnered with peer organizations to successfully reform Rhode Island's solar siting policy by removing incentives for clear-cutting forests—a victory spurred on by our education program students in Warwick, who urged their legislators to tackle climate change with renewable energy and protection of our forests. Plus, we won passage of a law that protects the people's constitutional right to access and enjoy the shorelines of Rhode Island's coast. At the same time, as you will see in this report, over 3,000 volunteers stepped up to clean our shorelines, advocate for policies that protect the Bay, and support our education programs.

Thanks to all of our members for making these achievements possible and helping Save The Bay take on today's challenges with increasingly strong programs that are sure to protect and improve Narragansett Bay for generations to come.

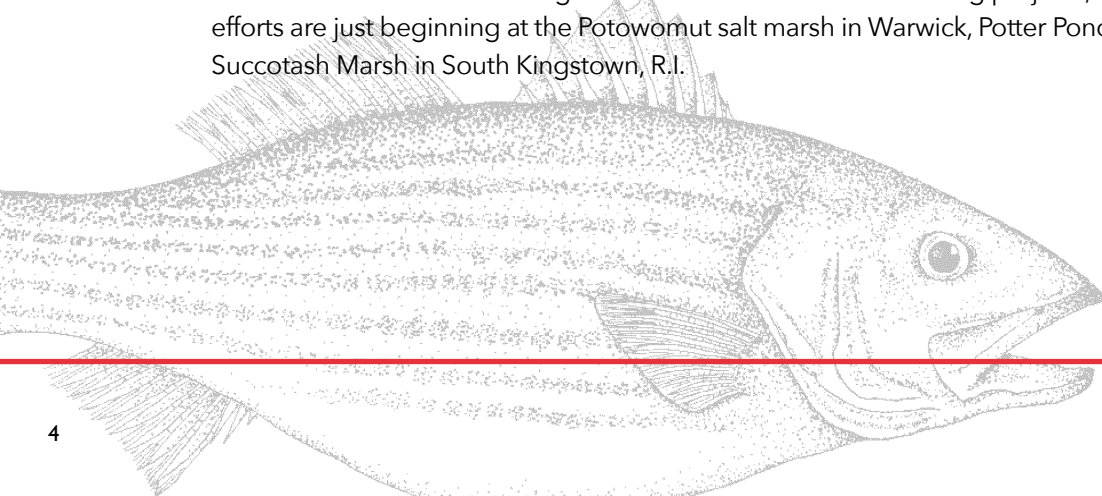

With your help...

Habitats are restored.

In 2023...

- Save The Bay's Baykeeper, Mike Jarbeau, and Coastkeeper, Dr. Catie Alves, continued water quality monitoring in Narragansett Bay, Little Narragansett Bay, and the Pawcatuck River estuary. In R.I.'s southern waters, this monitoring supports advocacy for improvements to wastewater and stormwater systems in Westerly and the Wood-Pawcatuck watershed; in the upper Bay, our testing also included bacteria samples that contribute to the R.I. Department of Health's Urban Beach Program.
- Our team continued to make progress in restoring river connectivity to several river habitats in the Bay watershed. In Warren, working with our partners at the Bristol County Water Authority, we have made significant progress in the restoration of the tidal flow to the Kickemuit River by removing the first of two dams that have negatively impacted the habitat for a century. (The second dam is slated for removal in 2024.) We also continued to advocate for dam removal around the watershed, including the Potter Hill Mill Dam in Westerly and the Rodman Mill Dam in North Kingstown, R.I.
- Responding to the increasingly dire need for a resilient shoreline, Save The Bay continued to work on projects that will restore coastal habitats as seas continue to rise. We partnered with the City of Warwick to remove two regularly flooded roads, which we replaced with beach grass and enhanced public access. We also worked with the Town of Barrington to restore a salt marsh, and give it space to move inland, by removing fill along the shoreline of a public park and planting native grasses and shrubs.
- Save The Bay continued to support the Bay's critically valuable salt marsh habitat, with ongoing work at several restoration sites, including the Palmer River in Warren and the Narrow River in Narragansett. In addition to our continuing projects, new efforts are just beginning at the Potowomut salt marsh in Warwick, Potter Pond and Succotash Marsh in South Kingstown, R.I.

In 2023...

- Our 2023 summer BayCamp season hosted 632 campers in grades K-12 at 26 public camps located in Providence, Wickford, Bristol and Newport. Save The Bay's tradition of offering the only week-long summer camp that takes place exclusively on Narragansett Bay continued, as campers enjoyed outdoor shoreline exploration, boat trips, experiments, arts and crafts and more.
- Save The Bay educators engaged over 12,000 students in 934 experiential school programs that highlighted topics ranging from climate change and marine science labs to water quality and animal adaptations.
- Thanks to funding from AmeriCorps, Save The Bay welcomed four AmeriCorps members to the education team in 2023. These service members support educational offerings at Save The Bay's Hamilton Family Aquarium.
- Save The Bay's popular Seal Tours, Nature Cruises and Lighthouse Tours each celebrated a successful season in 2023. Over 2,100 passengers stepped aboard a Save The Bay education vessel to spot seals, wildlife and lighthouses—and 100 percent of those passengers who completed our post-tour surveys would recommend their tour to a friend.
- In its final season, the Exploration Center and Aquarium on Easton's Beach welcomed tens of thousands of guests—but also rescued 50 "gulf stream orphans;" bred and released 35 catsharks and 50 little skates; and rescued and released a dozen freshwater turtles. *Save The Bay's Hamilton Family Aquarium on America's Cup Ave in Newport will expand these programs to further inspire our future Bay stewards.*

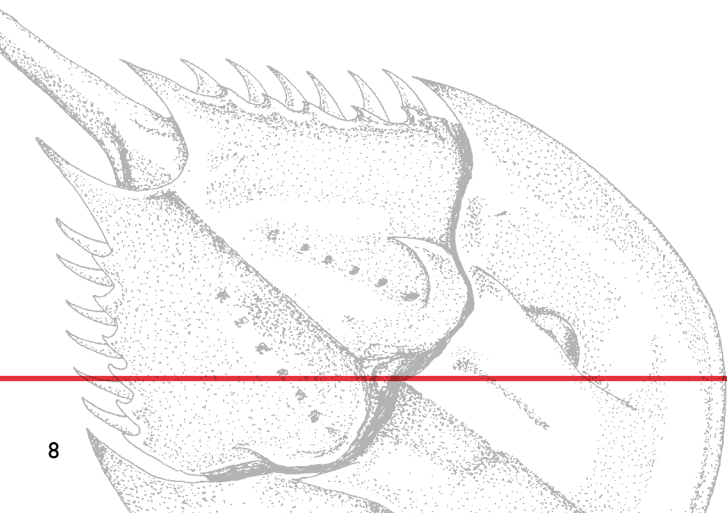

With your help...

Our community continues to grow.

In 2023...

- Fifty Save The Bay volunteers marked 1,773 storm drains in Bristol, Smithfield, and Warwick. These ongoing storm drain marking efforts help prevent pollution by raising awareness and promoting stewardship.
- Save The Bay's fundraising events—including Taste of The Bay, the Artists for the Bay Show & Sale, and the Swim—and community partnerships raised nearly \$658,000 in support of our mission to protect and improve Narragansett Bay.
- Save The Bay's popular internship program—which engages students in every area of our mission-based work—welcomed 53 interns last year.
- The iconic Swim fundraiser engaged 232 swimmers, 128 kayakers, and 150 volunteers in 2023. This two-mile, open water Swim from Newport to Jamestown—which serves as a celebration of the benefits of a healthy Narragansett Bay—raised \$261,155.
- Our International Coastal Cleanup effort engaged 2,830 volunteers who collected 132,912 pieces (22,480 pounds) of trash from Narragansett Bay shorelines between September and November. While collecting trash, these volunteers also collected data, which is included in both the Ocean Conservancy's global report and Save The Bay's Rhode Island report. (This year, for the first time ever, plastic and foam pieces were collected in greater quantity than cigarette butts, demonstrating a change in local litter trends.)

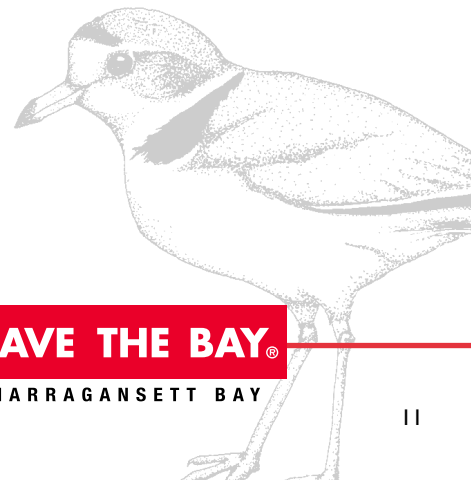

The Bay has a voice and a guardian.

In 2023...

- Policy staff reviewed hundreds of federal, state, and local development applications, regulatory documents, and pieces of proposed legislation for their potential impact on the Bay and watershed.
- Save The Bay celebrated a victory related to our vision of a fishable, swimmable Narragansett Bay, **accessible to all**: the passage of the 2023 Shoreline Access bill, which clarifies the location where the public can exercise their existing right to the Rhode Island shore.
- Consistent in our position that we support (and need) renewable energy that is properly sited, Save The Bay also celebrated a bill that put an end to a state program that incentivized the clearcutting of forests for solar farms. Forests play a key role in the health of the Narragansett Bay watershed, and the Bay itself.
- While efforts to establish a bottle bill were not successful, efforts made by Save The Bay and other environmental organizations did gain traction. The evidence? H 5502 Sub A, which establishes a joint legislative study commission to study the problem of plastic bottle waste. Save The Bay is among the commission members, alongside our friends at Clean Water Action RI and the Audubon Society of RI.

Financial Report

From our Treasurer

Dear Friends of Save The Bay,

It is my pleasure to report that our finances ended the fiscal year in a very strong position. Thanks to the ongoing support of donors large and small, foundations, and grantors, we continued to strengthen the balance sheet and position ourselves to withstand any unforeseen financial headwinds. (The positive impact of a dedicated staff cannot be overstated.)

Unrestricted contributions (1.4%) increased slightly in 2022, while Grants (15.8%), Government Contracts (60.2%) and Program Revenue (34.7%) all showed double digit gains. In order to achieve these results, we do spend more, but a key indicator of the leadership staff's keen oversight is reflected in the decline of General and Administrative expenses (6.6% in 2022 to 4.3% this year).

Also of note is how we allocate our spending. Compensation represented just over 56% of total expenses in 2023 and was allocated as follows: 32.2% toward the Education program and 24.1% to our Policy and Habitat work, versus 30.8% and 24.1% in 2022. Our other cost areas (Communications, General & Administrative and Fundraising) all showed a decline in percentage of compensation allocated to them in 2023, reflecting our ongoing emphasis on spending to achieve our organizational goals.

The investment portfolio rebounded from the turbulent 2022 market, finishing the year with a gain of \$341,745.

Fiscal year 2024 will herald a new chapter—and new opportunities—for Save The Bay, as we open Save The Bay's Hamilton Family Aquarium under the new leadership of Topher Hamblett as our Executive Director.

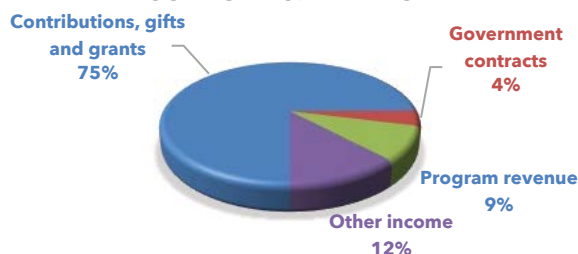

Board-Designated Endowment for Operating Support

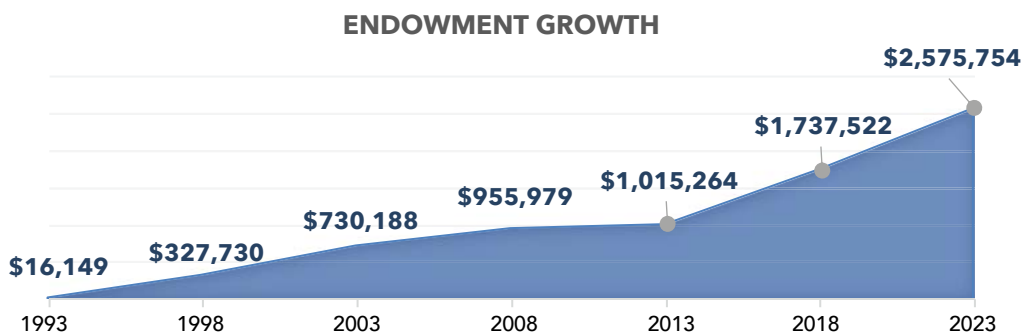
Designated by the Save The Bay Board of Directors, this endowment provides general operating support and the greatest flexibility in managing organizational resources in response to changing circumstances.
