# A message from our Board President and Executive Director

Dear Friends of Narragansett Bay,

With heartfelt thanks to our generous members, donors and volunteers, and of course to our staff, we are proud to present Save The Bay's 2025 Annual Report.

One of the enduring strengths of Save The Bay is our persistence in tackling the most pressing issues facing Narragansett Bay. Because of you, Save The Bay has the financial and operational resources to address our watershed's substantial challenges, now and in the future.

At its core, Save The Bay is a people-powered organization, forever expanding the community committed to protecting and improving Narragansett Bay. In 2025, thousands of volunteers fanned out along the Bay's shorelines to clean up litter and collect data that supports our advocacy for a bottle deposit law. Volunteers also rolled up their sleeves and put on their boots to restore the Bay's salt marshes and dune systems. They woke up in the pre-dawn hours to work at our annual Bay Swim, and went street by street to mark nearly 2,000 storm drains with the message, "Don't Dump! Drains to Bay."

Our Bay-saving community was strengthened through our BayCamps and our school-based, shipboard and public programs, which inspired more than 15,000 participants. In its second year, Save The Bay's Hamilton Family Aquarium in Newport welcomed tens of thousands of visitors of all ages to experience Narragansett Bay in new and exciting ways. Our team of aquarists expanded the Aquarium's "breed and release" program, in which seahorses, catsharks and little skates were raised in tanks and then released into their Bay habitats.

In the year ahead, we will continue our efforts to reform Rhode Island's troubled Coastal Resources Management Council, while championing policies to protect the Bay's natural shorelines threatened by erosion and development. And we will look to engage with all of you to envision and implement plans for the Narragansett Bay that we all want to see thrive. We thank you for making this work possible.

# Habitats Are Restored

## Nutrient-Reduction Education

Students from Chariho High School planted a demonstration rain garden at Charlestown's Cross Mills Fire Department as a nutrient reduction education project in partnership with the Town of Charlestown. This project is part of a pilot to improve the Green Hill and Ninigret salt pond watersheds.

## Restoring a Freshwater Wetland

Once the earthen berm associated with the former Upper Kickemuit River Dam was fully removed in 2024, the restoration of the former red maple swamp along the now tidally-influenced Kickemuit River became a reality. In partnership with the Bristol County Water Authority and with the support of dozens of volunteers, we planted native trees and shrubs in 2025.

## Restoring Tidal Flow in Galilee

In coordination with the RI Department of Environmental Management, we began restoring tidal flow at the Galilee salt marsh on the south side of the Galilee Escape Road in Narragansett, which was impacted by centuries of agricultural and mosquito control activities, road filling and commercial and residential development.

## Restoring Cold Water Stream Connectivity

We collaborated with the Towns of Hopkinton and Cumberland on the design of three new culverts to allow fish and amphibians to move upstream and downstream of the road crossings while reducing the risk of road flooding.



# Bay Stewards of All Ages Are Engaged

## BayCamp Season

Our 2025 summer BayCamp season welcomed 614 campers, who completed grades K-12 across 26 sessions in Providence, Newport, North Kingstown and Bristol. Save The Bay's unique week-long summer camp, held on the shores and waters of Narragansett Bay, resumed, as campers participated in outdoor shoreline exploration, boat excursions, scientific investigations, arts & crafts and other activities.

## School Day Programming

Save The Bay educators engaged 12,820 students in 862 hands-on school programs on Narragansett Bay, including animals, habitats, ecology, and climate change. Programs aligned with state science standards take place aboard Coast Guard-certified education vessels, at our Bay Center, Newport Aquarium, classrooms, and in Bay watershed habitats.

## After-School Programming

Save The Bay collaborates with a variety of partners to offer afterschool programs to students in their schools, at our Bay Center (Providence) or at our Hamilton Family Aquarium (Newport). Our afterschool programs are offered over multiple days, allowing students to acquire in-depth knowledge about Narragansett Bay in a more informal atmosphere. In 2025, Save The Bay educators engaged 475 students in 308 afterschool programs.

## Public Programming

Save The Bay's popular Seal Tours, Nature Cruises and Lighthouse Tours each celebrated a successful season in 2025. Over 2,900 passengers stepped aboard a Save The Bay education vessel to spot seals, wildlife and lighthouses – and 100 percent of those passengers who completed our post-tour surveys would recommend their tour to a friend.

## Storm Drain Marking

39 Save The Bay volunteers marked 1,955 storm drains in Cranston, Narragansett, Newport, Portsmouth, Swansea, Warwick, and Westerly with curb markers that say, "Don't Dump - Drains to Bay". These ongoing storm drain marking efforts help prevent pollution by raising awareness about the role storm drains play in carrying rainwater and pollution to the Bay and promoting stewardship of our local waters.

## International Coastal Cleanup

Our International Coastal Cleanup effort engaged 2,971 volunteers who collected 117,396 pieces (15,561 pounds) of trash from Narragansett Bay shorelines between September and November. These volunteers also collected data on the types and quantities of trash for inclusion in both the Ocean Conservancy's global report and Save The Bay's Rhode Island report.

## Swim Fundraiser

The iconic Swim fundraiser engaged 282 swimmers, 95 kayakers and 144 volunteers in 2025. This two-mile, open water swim from Newport to Jamestown – which serves as a celebration of the benefits of a healthy Narragansett Bay – raised over \$312,000.



## Additional Fundraising

Our Taste of The Bay event, sponsorships and joint ventures provide nearly \$100,000 of vital support, that helps to fund our advocacy, restoration and education programming. We are grateful to those businesses, corporations and individuals who make these initiatives possible.

Our Community Access sponsorships provide access to our Aquarium for families receiving SNAP/EBT benefits and for our active and retired military personnel, ensuring the Aquarium is accessible to all.

## Internships

Save The Bay's popular internship program – which engages students in every area of our mission-based work – welcomed 63 interns last year. Interns learned a range of skills, including Aquarium education, aquarist operations, coastal advocacy and monitoring, graphic design and communications, photography and videography, volunteer management and habitat restoration.

# A Voice And A Guardian For The Bay

## Oversight

Advocacy staff reviewed hundreds of federal, state and local development applications, regulatory documents and pieces of legislation for their potential impact on the Bay and watershed, submitting comments on those deemed to pose the greatest threat.

## Voter Action Center

Our VoterVoice platform – which allows residents across the region to make their voices heard by writing directly to their elected representatives on matters important to Narragansett Bay – engaged over 800 advocates in 2025.

## ProvPort Master Plan

Along with leaders from the South Providence community, advocacy staff participated in the Master Plan Advisory Committee, which is helping to shape plans for Providence’s working waterfront for the next 30 years.

## Bottle Bill Report

As a member of the Special Joint Legislative Commission to Study and Provide Recommendations to Protect our Environment from Plastic Bottle Waste, Save The Bay helped shape the commission’s Final Report, issued in April 2025 after 18 months of meetings. The report recommended that Rhode Island should join neighboring states and adopt a deposit return system for single-use beverage containers, by enacting a ‘bottle bill.’

## CRMC – Accountability and Reform

Save The Bay continued to watchdog the RI Coastal Resources Management Council (CRMC), calling out the Council’s failure to enforce environmental laws, violating the law and its own procedures and favoring the politically connected. We also pressed for reforming the agency through removal of the appointed Council from its structure and providing it the resources it needs to effectively protect, restore and manage Rhode Island’s coast.

## Attendance

The excitement and enthusiasm that Aquarium visitors share have been uplifting. Since opening, we have welcomed tens of thousands of guests at the Hamilton Family Aquarium. Our guests are not only leaving with a deeper knowledge of the Bay, but they are also becoming members, supporters and volunteers of Save The Bay – giving us confidence that Narragansett Bay will be in good hands for years to come.

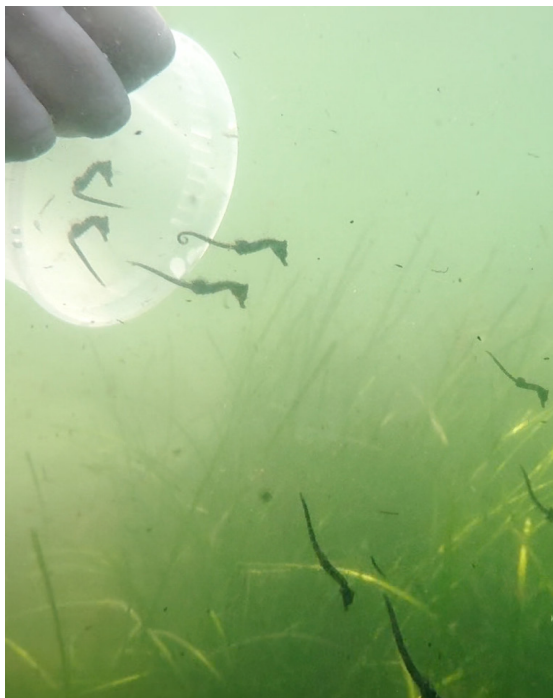
## Accessibility

Save The Bay is proud to be certified by Kulture City as a sensory-inclusive location with trained staff and sensory bags available to interested guests. The Aquarium is fortunate to have several staff and volunteer educators who know Spanish, French and American Sign Language.

## Conservation Programs

The Aquarium is also home to Save The Bay's nationally recognized breed and release program which reintroduces Northern lined seahorses, little skates & chain catsharks back to local waters. The back-of-house hatchery and nursery tanks, coupled with larger front-of-house exhibits to support breeding efforts, have greatly expanded our research and education capacity, and increased the number and size of species we can release in Narragansett Bay and Rhode Island Sound.

# Financial Report

Dear Friends of Save The Bay,

I am pleased to report that the financial health of our organization for the year ended June 30, 2025, is strong. The successful opening of the Hamilton Family Aquarium in Newport came off without a hitch and provides a more robust revenue stream than did our Easton's Beach facility to help fund our education and habitat restoration initiatives. And its opening was accomplished without taking on any debt, a great testament to the support provided by our individual donors and foundations.

The balance sheet remains solid with Total Assets at 12 times our Total Liabilities. We hold a strong cash position, the majority of which is invested, and our Investment Portfolio grew by 14.7% year over year to just over \$4.1 million. The opening of the Aquarium supports the broader mission of Save The Bay and has become an integral, self-sustaining part of our organization. Advocacy accounted for 22% of total expenses (up from 21% in Fiscal 2024) and Education increased to 53% from 51%.

Management and the Board continued to carefully monitor spending, as evidenced by our other key expense categories. Communications spending was flat at 7%, despite the ongoing evolution of how we reach our constituents via social and traditional media, while Fundraising (15% vs. 18%) and General & Administrative expenses (2% vs. 3%) each saw a decrease in the amount of total expenses allocated to these categories. Of note, this was accomplished despite the cancellation of two Government contracts during the year, which forced management to pivot mid-stream and ensure that our ongoing activities were affected as little as possible.

Also of note was the exceptional support provided by the many volunteers who assist with habitat restoration initiatives, beach cleanups, serve as volunteer educators at the Aquarium or assist with our development activities. For fiscal year 2025, 26,480 volunteer hours were recorded. Though these efforts may not show up on the Balance Sheet or Income Statement, they are greatly appreciated and valued.

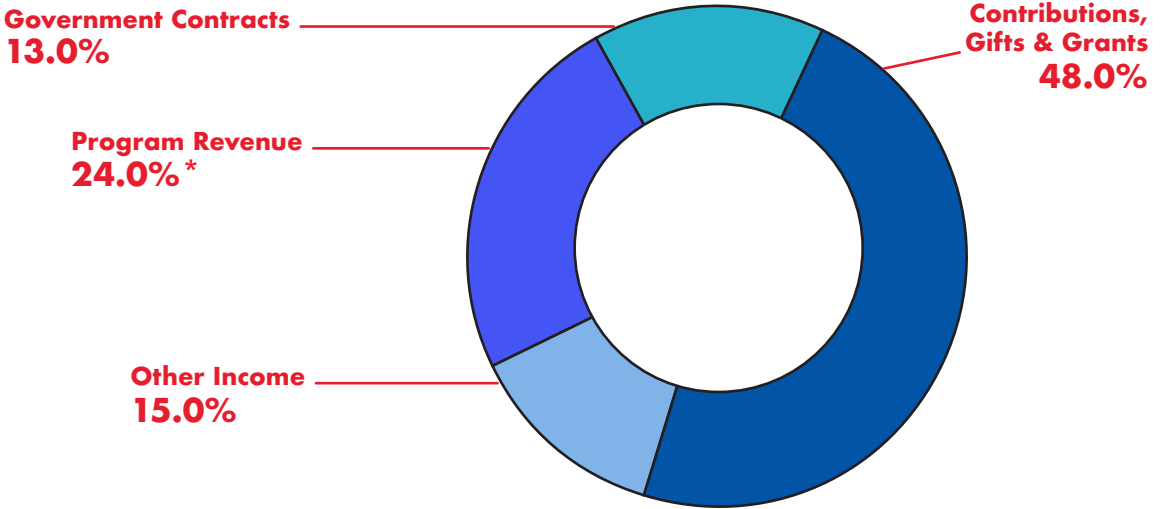
Fiscal year 2026 is sure to bring us more opportunities and challenges, but with the continued support of our loyal donors and a dedicated management team, we are ready to take them on.

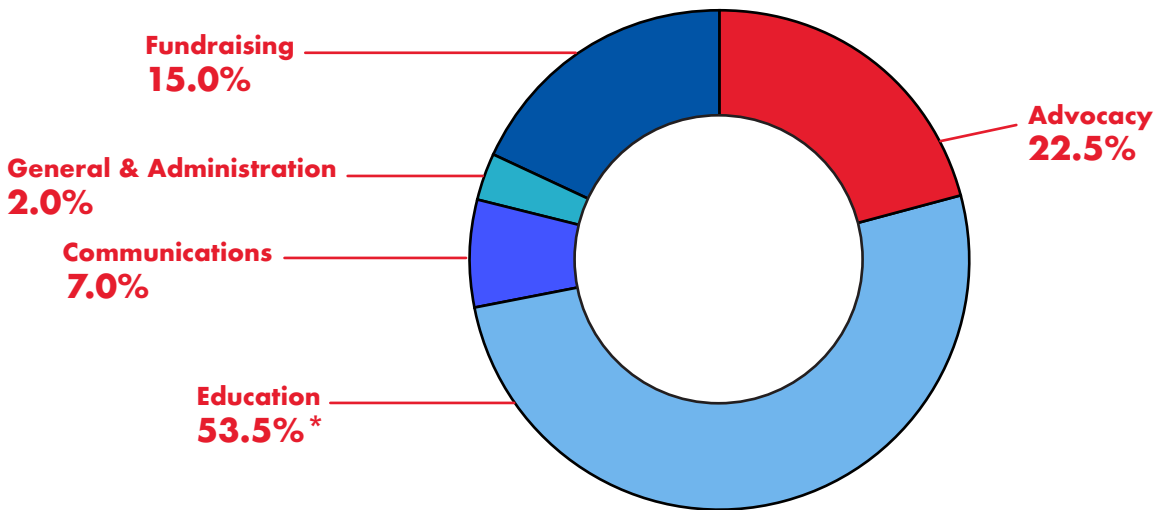

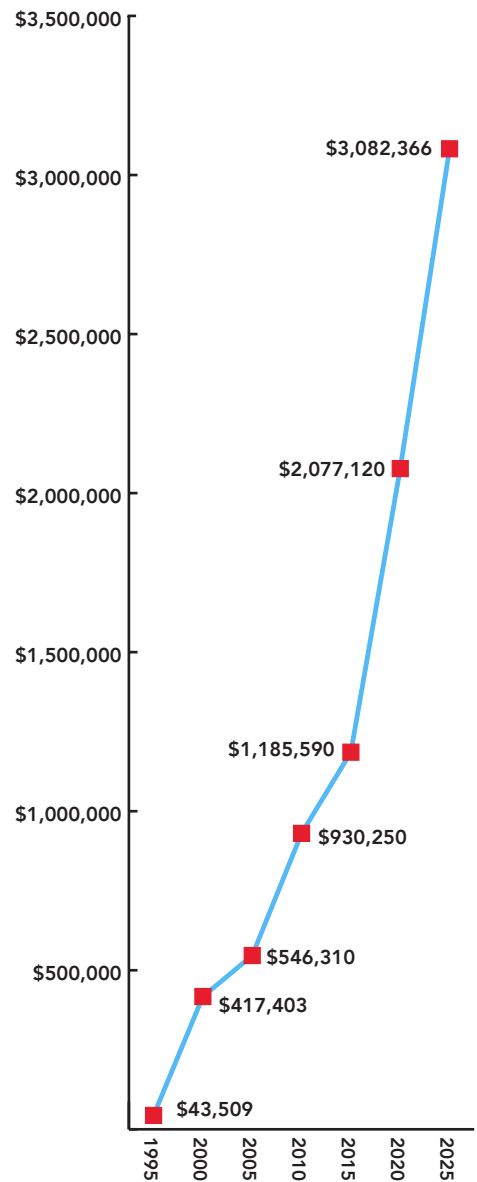
## Endowment Funds

### Our endowment funds include:

- **Board-Designated Endowment for Operating Support:** Managed by the Board, this endowment provides flexible operating support to adapt to changing needs.
- **Donor-Designated Endowment for Operating Support:** Gifts to this endowment support our advocacy, restoration, and education programs.
- **The Alison Walsh Fund:** Supports an annual award for outstanding environmental advocacy.
- **The Roosa Family Fund for Marine Education:** Supports marine education for schoolchildren.
- **The John H. Chafee Memorial Fund:** Honors Senator Chafee's environmental legacy and supports education programs.
- **The Julia Sands Chase Fund:** Honors Mrs. Chase's memory and supports Save The Bay's mission. Donor-Designated Endowment for Operating Support.
