e love our beaches and coastlines in Rhode Island. We're the Ocean State, after all. But trash left behind by beach-goers, blown to the shorelines by the wind, and washed to the coast by stormwater runoff has countless negative effects on ocean life, coastal communities and Rhode Island's economy.

On September 19, 2015, Save The Bay led 85 beach cleanups in 20 towns, where 2,199 volunteers collected trash and debris from 65 miles of shoreline and recorded what they found. In this report, you'll find a summary of trash collected during this year's cleanup. Our local data will become part of a global report on marine trash around the world.

We call on you, our community members, to take the actions found in this report to help us protect and improve the water quality and marine life of Narragansett Bay.


6 DEGREES OF SEPARATION: How Does Trash Travel?

TOP ITEMS COLLECTED



HOW YOU CAN HELP REDUCE MARINE DEBRIS IN NARRAGANSETT BAY



CONTAIN YOUR BUTTS. Cigarette filters are NOT biodegradable.

Use a container for your butts so they don't reach waterways and the ocean.



TOSS IT IN.

Trash tossed out on streets and sidewalks, even far from the shore, ends up in storm drains and washes into the Bay. Use trash cans.





When you go to the beach, take a trash bag with you and pick up surrounding trash you see. People are less likely to litter on a clean beach.
